The World of Work in the Creative Industries

The *Cultural Exchange* brings together the major cultural and creative employers in Leeds to offer a collaborative work experience opportunity to pupils. It showcases the variety of non-performance careers available in the Creative Industries.

Pupils will gain a unique insight into the workings of the most exciting cultural and creative venues, organisations, and companies working in Leeds. After their work experience, pupils will have an understanding of the qualifications and skills needed to work in the creative industries and the varied employment opportunities available to them.

The creative industries encompass a broad range of areas:

- Advertising and Marketing
- Architecture
- Crafts
- Design (Product, Graphic, Fashion)
- Film, TV, Animation, Radio and Photography
- IT, Video Games and Software
- Museums, Galleries, Heritage, Libraries
- Music, Performing Arts, Visual Arts,
- Publishing

The Cultural Exchange will

- Expose young people to the range of careers available in the cultural and creative sector with a particular focus on the creative industry local to them in Leeds
- Widen the scope of work experience currently offered and help schools to fulfil the Gatsby Benchmarks of Good Career Guidance
- Give pupils an understanding of the skills and qualifications needed to progress into the sector both as an employee or freelance/self-employed creative
- Raise pupils' aspirations for working in the creative industries
- Provide opportunities for young people to meet professionals working in the creative industries and hear their experiences first-hand
- Help young people to engage with well-known, but often inaccessible cultural organisations, who have a long-term ambition of improving the diversity of those who are employed in the creative and cultural sector

Grand Futures Leeds Arts Network

The Cultural Exchange is a collaboration between cultural and creative organisations in Leeds who belong to the Grand Futures Leeds Arts Network. This network of venues, organisations and companies work across a wide range of industries and share a passion for engaging with young people and making their work forces diverse and open to all.

It is an ever-evolving network, and we have lots of supporters from across the creative sector who are keen to be involved in the *Cultural Exchange*.

Cultural Exchange programme

Each work experience programme is bespoke to the school or educational establishment we are working with. It will be created in collaboration with the school and Grand Futures, working on agreed dates/times and costs that work for everyone.

Leeds Heritage Theatres co-ordinates the activity on behalf of Grand Futures. They act as a point of contact for the *Cultural Exchange* both for the school and the network.

Ideally, we work with a group of approximately 20 pupils who have an interest in the creative industries.

Activity can take place over 5 days (a minimum of 3) with an additional introduction and evaluation session taking place prior to and after the programme in school.

Cost £1500 - £2000 (approximate, dependent on the activity)

The school or educational establishment will need to provide:

- A designated point of contact at school who we will communicate with regularly about the *Cultural Exchange* programme. This is usually the careers, widening participation or raising aspirations lead.
- A member of school staff to be with the group during all of the activity.
- Any travel costs or lunches will need to be provided by the school. As this is work experience, we encourage independent travel, and we keep travel across the city to a minimum.
